


## Art Year 3: Portraits – facial expressions Summer 2

	sketch	A rough drawing often made to assist in the making of a final piece.
	portrait	A painting, drawing, photograph, or engraving of a person, especially one showing only the face or head and shoulders.
SATISFACTION ANUSCINAT JOY LAUMTER	facial expression	A form of non verbal communication where a person's face shows how they are feeling.
DLECTON PELACION SADNESS GET	pencil grades	Pencils are classified as either: soft black (B), hard (H), hard black (HB), and firm (F). The degree of soft black, hard, hard black, and firm are then further classified by numbers, the higher the number the higher the intensity.
