Vocabulary	
ceramics	Pots and other articles made from clay and hardened by heat or air.
sculpture	Sculpture is three dimensional art made by carving, modelling or placing materials together. They can be made out of clay, stone, wood and any other material that the artist wishes to use.
hollowing	Removing the inside of a solid.
score	To score a piece of clay means to scratch marks on it as part of the joining process. This is done before brushing on slip and joining two pieces together. The process is often called, "Score and slip."
glaze	A coating of coloured liquid glass applied to ceramics before firing.
slip	A mixture of clay and water to join handles, spouts and pieces of decoration.
