Our Big Question

As geographers we will:

As scientists we will:

- Investigate plants in our area and investigate minibeasts in our school grounds.

As computer programmers we will:

- Using 2paint on PurpleMash to create pictures.
- Develop research skills through searching for information on the internet.
- Improve note-taking skills through the use of mind mapping.
- Develop presentation skills through creating and delivering a short multimedia presentation.
- Developing the British Values of Individual Liberty, Rule of Law, Democracy and Mutual Respect and Tolerance in our learning.
- Using the 10 Happiness Keys for a variety of well being activities.

As writers we will:

- Continue to develop our fluency rate to ensure we can read at least 90 words per minute.
- Continue to develop our ability to retrieve information from the text to answer a range of questions.
- Share a range of extended stories and stories by significant children's authors related to our topic on animals and plants.
- Investigate poems with language play (riddles, tongue twisters etc.).
- Use present and past verbs correctly and consistently within my writing.
- Use descriptive language (expanded noun phrases e.g. the fierce, scaly dragon).

As SPaG collectors we will:

Punctuation:

- Use clear capital letters, full stops, <u>question marks</u> and exclamation marks within sentences.
- Use commas in lists.
- Use capital letters for names of people, days of the week, months of the year.

Sentences:

 Understand and use statements, questions, commands and exclamations.

Word groups:

 Use powerful verbs, adjectives, nouns, adverbs, conjunctions and time connectives.



As mathematicians we will:

- Add and subtract single digit numbers, multiples of ten and any two-digit number to/from any given two digit number.
- Add three single digit numbers (e.g. 7 + 6 + 3).
- Recall multiplication and division facts for the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables up to x12.
- Recognise that division is the inverse of multiplication and use to check multiplication calculations.
- Recognise and find fractions of shapes, a set of objects and amounts (1/2, 1/4, 2/4, 3/4, 1/3).
- Combine amounts to make a particular value.
- Read o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to.
- Read the clock in five minute intervals (past the hour).
- Solve reasoning problems linked to addition, subtraction, multiplication and division using familiar methods.
