- When Neil stepped foot on the moon for the first time, he said the now famous line, "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."
- Mae Jemison was the first African American woman to become an astronaut. She was a part of the crew of the space shuttle Endeavour, which orbited Earth for more than a week in 1992.
- Tim Peake is a British astronaut. In 2016 he became the first official British astronaut to walk in space.
