Sticky Knowledge

The Great Fire of London was a fire that took place in 1666, lasting for five days.



The fire spread quickly because the houses were made of wood, they had thatched roofs.



Different levels can be used in dance. Movements take place on three levels: high, middle and low level.



Unison is when two or more dancers perform the same dance movement at the same time.

A **sequence** is where a pattern of dance moves are followed, often in beats of 4, 8, 16 or even 32.
