This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Curriculum music

At Griffie Field Primary our school music curriculum is informed by the National Curriculum and the model music curriculum (March 2021), non-statutory guidance for teaching music from Key Stages 1 to 3.

We have a bespoke scheme of work which allows all children including disabled pupils and pupils with special educational needs to access music at our school

- In Foundation stage, children take part in a discrete music session as well as exploring sound, pulse and rhythm through continuous early years provision
- In Key stage one, pupils have a timetabled 45 minute weekly music session as well as singing in other curriculum areas
- In Key Stage two, pupils have a 1 hour timetabled music lesson each week, from Year 2 onwards every child takes part in a whole class instrument session: Year 2 – handbells, Year 3 – glockenspiel, Year 4 – ukulele, Year 5 and 6 - Recorder

Extra-curricular music

At Griffie Field Primary we offer a variety of musical opportunities outside of lesson time, these include:

1:1 peripatetic lessons in Flute, Brass, Piano and Guitar

Any parents/carers who qualify for pupil premium can access music lessons free of charge as part of their premium.

Pupils also have the opportunity to participate in the Young Voices choir. The choir practices take place in the Autumn term, in preparation for a performance at Young Voices.

In the Summer term, children in Year 2 and above can join an afterschool choir. Katie Woodright from the music partnership leads the choir and parents pay for this club

Musical events and experiences

At Griffie Field, we ensure that all pupils have musical experiences. These experiences include:

Class/Year group assembly performances every term

Christmas performances by Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1

Summer musical by Year 5 and 6

Celebration assemblies

Music Maestro concert

Live music performances every term including a Year 4 trip to see 'The snowman' live

Young Voices performance

Singing carols in the community

In the future

At Griffie Field we will continue all the amazing work we do in Music and include the pupil voice in developing even more musical opportunities for all our pupils. We also hope to set up a music ensemble this year to allow pupils the chance to play an instrument in a group.
