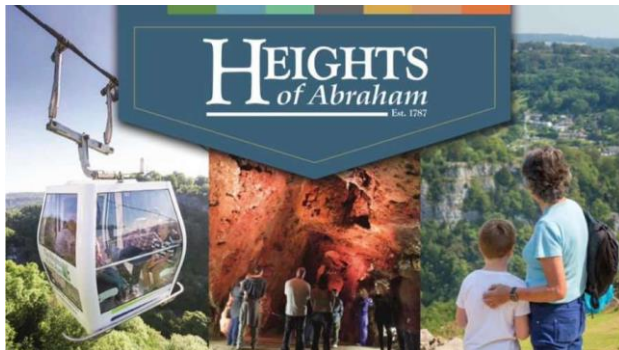
Prior Learning

Sticky Knowledge

- People travel to different places for different reasons
- People chose to travel to different areas for tourism
- Tourism creates lots of jobs for people and brings in money
- Derbyshire is home to the Peak District National Park – the first of 15 national parks designated in 1951
- Over 13million people visit the Peak District every year.



Vocabulary

Attractions	a thing or quality that attracts people (beaches, arcades, amusement park)
fieldwork	Using maps to go out and about to get a practical understanding of something.
Industrial	Businesses that provide products or services
Leisure	Time spent away from work relaxing.
National Park	An area of countryside, protected by the state for the enjoyment of the general public or the preservation of wildlife.
Retail	To sell products to people
Tourists	People who travel to a different place other than their home

Advantages of Tourism

- Keeps traditions alive
