- The Fairtrade Foundation began in the United Kingdom in 1992.

Co-operative	a farm, business, or other organization which is owned and run jointly by its members, who share the profits or benefits.
Consumer	Person who buys the goods or services
Country of origin	Country where items were made or grown
Export	Send goods to another country for sale
Fair trade	Trade where producers are paid a fair price for their goods
Import	Bring goods into a country for sale
Industry	Group of businesses that provide a particular product or service
Producer	Person or business that makes or grows good for sale
Raw material	Basic material from which a product is made
Retailer	Person or business that sells good or services
Sustainable	Not harmful to the environment or depleting natural resources
Trade	Buying or selling goods or services
