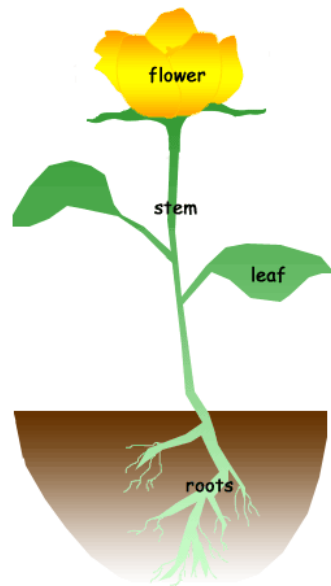

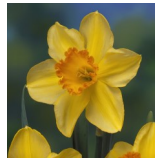
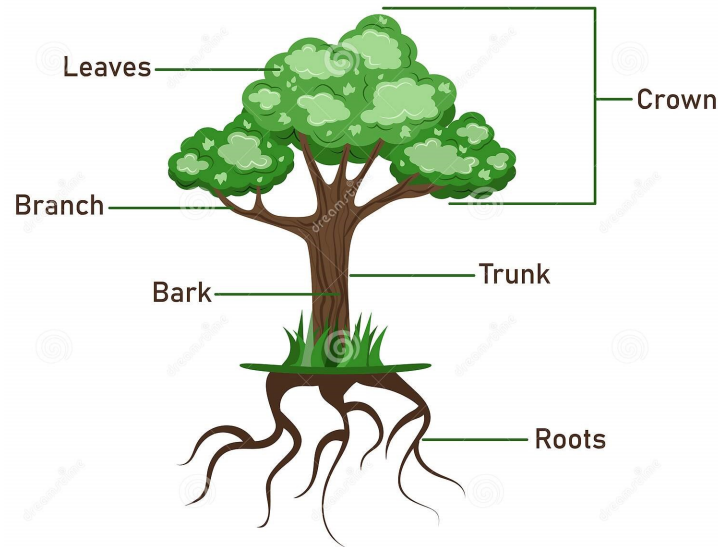
Vocabulary

Blossom	A name for the flower on a tree. A fruit with a stone grows from these.
Branches	Part of the tree that grows out of the trunk.
Deciduous	A plant that loses its leaves in the autumn and grows new ones in the spring.
Evergreen	A plant that has green leaves all year round.
Flower	Part of the plant that grows that can produce seeds.
Fruit	A part of a plant that grows that contains seeds. You can eat fruit.
Leaves	A flat part of a plant that grows from the stem or branches.
Roots	The part of the plant that is underground. It helps the plant to find water and nutrients. It also helps hold the plant in the ground.
Seed	A small part of a flowering plant that is made which can grow a new plant.
Stem	The main part of a plant that grows from the roots.
Trunk	The stem of a tree. It is hard and woody.
Vegetable	A part of a plant that grows that can be eaten. It could be the root, stem or leaves of a plant.

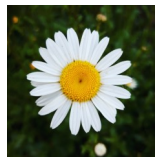
