Children have...

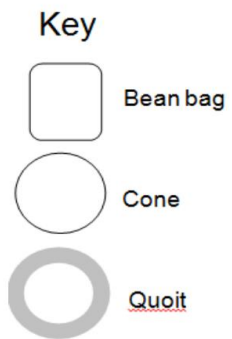
- Worked collaboratively as a pair and in small groups.

Outdoor adventurous activities are fun tasks/ games that you take part in when you are outside.

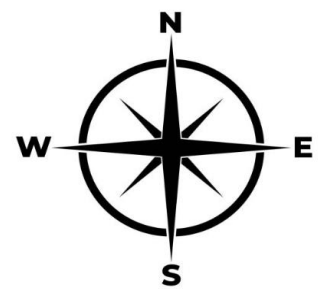
A map is a picture of an area of land.

Sticky Knowledge

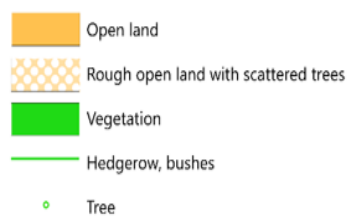


Some examples of outdoor adventurous activities include: team games, mountain biking, orienteering, problem solving and hiking.
