## Key Vocabulary

|                            |   |
|----------------------------|---|
| address book               | a list of people who you regularly send an email to.  |
| attachment                 | A file, which could be a piece of work or a picture, that is sent with an email.                  |
| BCC<br>(Blind Carbon Copy) | A way of privately sending a copy of your email to other people without the recipient knowing.    |
| CC<br>(Carbon Copy)        | A way of sending a copy of your email to other people so they can see the information in it.      |
| communication              | The sharing or exchanging of information by speaking, writing or using another way such as email. |
| email<br>(electronic mail) | An internet service that allows people to send and receive instant electronic letters.            |
| inbox                      | The folder where new emails go into when they are received.                                       |
| personal information       | Information that can identify you, such as your name, address or telephone number.                |
| save to draft              | Allows you to compose an email and save it so you can review before sending.                      |
| trusted contact            | A person that you know and trust, making an email from them safe to open.                         |
