

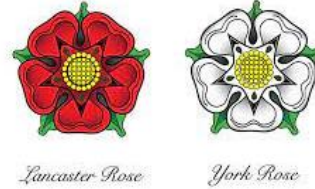
Year 5 History: Tudors

Prior Learning

- The Queen Elizabeth I was monarch from 1558 to 1603 (Y1)
- Counting in Roman numerals (Y3)
- Mary Queen of Scots was imprisoned at Tutbury Castle at the request of Queen Elizabeth because Mary persisted in attempting to claim the throne. (Y4)
- The Maya civilization was biggest between the years of 420 AD and 900 AD. (Y5)
- The Maya civilization spread all the way from Mexico to Honduras, Guatemala, and northern El Salvador. (Y5)

Sticky Knowledge

- The Tudor period ran from 1485 to 1603
- The Tudor monarchs were:
 - * Henry VII – defeated Richard III in the Battle of Bosworth
 - * Henry VIII – became king aged 17; married 6 times
 - * Edward VI – Henry’s son; king from age 9-15 years old
 - * Lady Jane Grey – queen for just 9 days before Mary imprisoned her
 - * Mary I – Henry’s daughter
 - * Elizabeth I – Henry’s daughter, reigned for nearly 45 years
- Henry VIII wives were:
 - Catherine of Aragon (divorced)
 - Anne Boleyn (beheaded)
 - Jane Seymour (died)
 - Anne of Cleves (divorced)
 - Catherine Howard (beheaded)
 - Katherine Parr (survived)



Vocabulary

Catholic	The Catholic Church is a denomination of Christianity . It is the largest denomination of Christians, with over 1 billion people in the Church.
Heir	A person who will inherit the throne when the current king or queen dies.
Henry VIII	Henry VIII was King of England and Ireland from 21 April 1509 until 28 January 1547
Monarch	A ruler such as a king, queen, or emperor. Queen Elizabeth is currently the monarch of the United Kingdom and its dominions.
Mary Rose	The Mary Rose was an English warship that was built during the reign of King Henry VIII
Protestant	Protestantism is the second largest branch of Christianity.
Reformation	It was a split in the Catholic Church where a new type of Christianity called Protestantism was born.
Reign	To rule over a country as king or queen.
Tudor	The Tudors were a Welsh-English royal dynasty who ruled England and Wales from 1485 until 1603.
