Prior Learning

- Who is a Christian/Muslim and what do they believe? (Year 1).
- What makes some places sacred? (Year 2). Christians place of worship is a Church and a Muslims place of worship is a Mosque.



Sticky Knowledge

- Describe and make connections between examples of religious creativity (buildings and art).
- Show understanding of the value of sacred buildings and art. For example, in Islamic art and architecture, there are no images of Allah. Instead, geometric and natural pattern is used to create beauty. Cathedrals and Churches have been created, often over many hundreds of years, to make space for people to worship God and to express in architecture a Christian sense of the magnificence of God and the value of spiritual life.
- Understand why some believers see generosity and charity as more important than buildings and art. There are many Christian & Muslim charities which help those in poverty around the world.



Vocabulary

Christian	People who follow the religion of Christianity.
Muslim	People who follow the religion of Islam.
Church	A place of worship for Christians.
Mosque	A place of worship for Muslims.
Architecture	The art or practice of designing and constructing buildings.
Charity	The voluntary giving of help, typically in the form of money, to those in need.
Generosity	Someone showing generosity is happy to give time, money, food, or kindness to people in need.
Scriptures	Any book or body of writings, especially when regarded as sacred by a particular religious group.
