



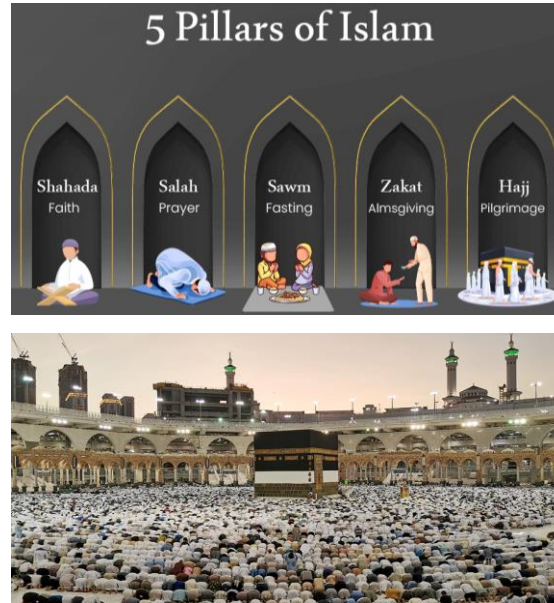

What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today?

Prior Learning

- Who is a Muslim and what do they believe? (Year 1). What does it mean to belong to a faith community? (Year 1).
- Recognise and name some of the Islamic symbols.
- Know the name of the place of worship for Muslims (Mosque) and their holy book (The Qur'an).
- Understand that Muslims fast during Ramadan.



Vocabulary

Muslim	People who follow the religion of Islam.
Mosque	A place of worship for Muslims.
Qur'an	The holy book for Muslims.
The Five Pillars of Islam	There are five key practices that Muslims are encouraged to fulfil. These practices are referred to as pillars because they form the foundation of Muslim life.
Shahada	A belief in one God.
Salah	Prayer (five times a day).
Zakat	The giving of alms. The act of giving a portion of a Muslim's wealth to those in need.
Sawm	Fasting during Ramadan.
Hajj	The sacred pilgrimage to Mecca.
Pilgrimage	A journey to a holy place.

Sticky Knowledge

- Make connections between Muslim practice of the Five Pillars (shahada, salah, zakat, sawm, hajj) and their beliefs about God and the Prophet Muhammad.
- Describe and reflect on the significance of the Holy Qur'an to Muslims.
- Make connections between the key functions of the mosque and the beliefs of Muslims.
